### **ABOUT US**

MAHILA VIKAS AND SHISHU SANSKAR KENDRA (MVASSK) was established in the year 2000 under The Societies Registration Act, 1860 and The Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 at Thane with the goal of addressing the social economic development of marginalized communities, with a special focus on women and children.

In 1998, a group of motivated young people from Navi Mumbai, moved by the plight of brick labourer's children volunteered to work on their health, hygiene and education. They also started a Balwadi (day care) and typing classes in Kalyan for these children. The group later started working with village school education committees in 14 villages of Wai block in Satara district. These efforts gradually led towards advocacy on 73rd and 74th amendment for 33% reservation for women in Panchayati Raj Institutions and decentralization of powers and authorities to Urban Local Bodies, with support from Resource and Support Centre for Development (RSCD). After more than a decade of tireless ground work, MVASSK received its first formal funding in the year 2012 from Mumbai District AIDS Control Society (MDACS) for working with 5000 truckers on HIV/AIDS prevention, care and support; the project continues till date having covered 6,80,000 truckers in Mumbai.

# ROJECTS

HIV/AIDS Prevention, Care and Support Project with Truckers in Mumbai: Supported by Mumbai District AIDS Control Society (MDACS) (2012 - 2022)

6,80,000 truck drivers and workers such as cleaners and helpers in Mumbai have been supported with HIV prevention, treatment and care services such as HIV testing, STI screening and treatment, condom distribution and behaviour change communication sessions. 120 truckers living with HIV have received care and referral services. The project currently provides services to 20000 truckers.

HIV/AIDS Prevention, Care and Support Project with Migrants in Navi Mumbai: Supported by Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI) [2014-2017] and Maharashtra State AIDS Control Society (MSACS) [2016 – 2022]

7,38,788 migrants in Mumbai have been supported with HIV prevention, treatment and care services such as HIV testing, STI screening and treatment, condom distribution and behaviour change communication sessions. 90 migrants living with HIV have received care and referral services. The project currently provides services to 30000 migrants.




### HIV/AIDS Prevention, Care and Support Project with Female Sex Workers (FSWs) in Navi Mumbai: Supported by MSACS (2016-2022)

1864 FSWs in Airoli are receiving HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and referral services. MVASSK also facilitates their access to social entitlements and welfare schemes such as Aadhaar card, PAN card, Ration card and Nav Sanjiveeni Yojana. MVASSK regularly does advocacy and conducts sensitization programs with various stakeholders, thereby addressing and reducing incidences of crisis against FSWs.

POSHAN PROJECT: In Collaboration with ANNADA - Association for Nutrition and Development Action and Supported by United Way Mumbai (2016-2020)

The project POSHAN focused on malnutrition and provided nutritional support (premix food items -Upma, Poha, Soyabean Laddu, Ragi Laddu, Wheat Laddu) to 1200 kids in Karjat and 837 kids in



The project achieved 100% success as all 2037 children, including the 52 severely malnourished children admitted to D.Y. Patil Nerul Hospital, had recovered from malnutrition.



#### Support for Health Initiatives by United Way Mumbai (2017-2019):

- · Awareness, testing and referral services concerning diabetes to 8000 migrants in Mumbai and Navi Mumbai.
- · Hepatitis B vaccination of 5000 migrants in Navi Mumbai.
